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RE-designing Access to Cultural Heritage for a wider participation in preservation, (re-)use and management of European culture

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REACH and its challenge

- REACH is a **social platform** which aims at linking participatory approaches with the capacity of resilience.
- The main goal is to develop an understanding of the challenges and opportunities for research and innovation in the participatory preservation, (re)use and management of cultural heritage.
- The project identified **theoretical participatory models** and tested them in the practice through **four thematic pilots** in order to propose the adoption of an integrated model of **resilient European cultural heritage**.



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How the **Resilience** of cultural heritage is connected with **Good practices** of participation?

- Resilience is investigated in the REACH project from the perspective of the capacity of the cultural heritage system (including tangible and intangible heritage) to survive and readapt to political, social, historical and economical changes.
- good practices of participation based on a bottom-up approach for facilitating the resilience of communities and the resilience of heritage



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Successful **participatory models** and **experimental pilots**

- **Requirements:** Capacity to be **Dynamic**, **Resilient**, easily **Adaptable** to social cultural and economic changes.
- **The REACH pilots covers four thematic areas:**
 - Minority** heritage
 - Institutional** heritage
 - Rural** heritage
 - Small towns** heritage
- They aimed to advocate the socio-economic value of civic participation in preservation, (re-)use and management of cultural heritage.
- The four pilots engaged different types of communities and stakeholders in different situations and political backgrounds
- Their implementation reached to gather and discuss **best practices in the development of resilient policies** in community building, education, data management and protection of intellectual rights.



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Pilot on Minority Heritage



Pilot leader: **Eötvös Loránd University, Budapest**

Case study: The pilot's focus is on the largest transnational minority group in Europe, the Cultural Heritage of Roma communities based in Hungary

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Pilot on Institutional Heritage



Pilot leader: **SPK, Prussian Cultural Heritage Foundation, Berlin**

Case study: focused on a group of German museums the pilot faced the difficulties to engage citizen in Institutional cultural heritage and identified successful participatory practices

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Pilot on Rural Heritage



Pilot leader: **Universidad de Granada**

Case study: The pilot on rural heritage focusses mainly on approaches in the recovery and preservation of rural communities and landscape of Sierra Nevada in Spain and the Ticino park in the North of Italy.

- the memories of their ancestors



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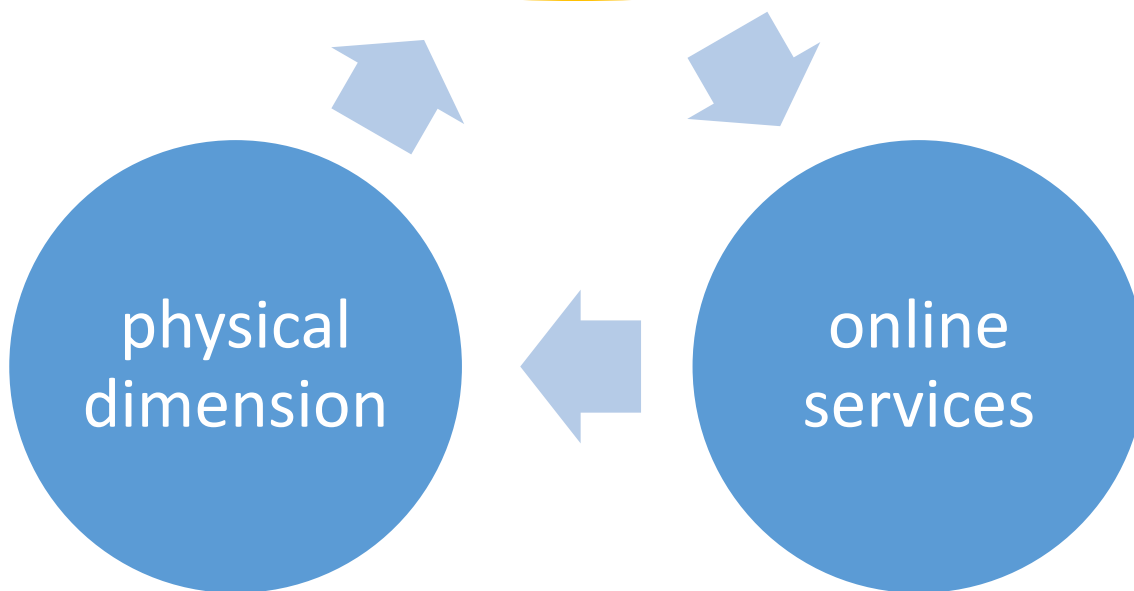
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The REACH social platform and its sustainability
