

Objectives of the EYCH 2018

- To encourage the sharing and appreciation of Europe's cultural heritage as a shared resource;
- To raise awareness of common history and values;
- To reinforce a sense of belonging to Europe;
- To better protect, safeguard, reuse, enhance, valorise and promote Europe's cultural heritage.



EYCH 2018 buzzing with activity

- 37 countries
- 38 stakeholder organisations
- 19 Commission's DGs
- EU institutions/bodies
- Over 18 000 events reaching 10 million people
- 14 000 labelled projects and events.
 - incl. over 900 EU funded projects
 (Horizon 2020, Erasmus +, Interreg, etc)









Ten European initiatives responding to four objectives

Engagement

- Shared heritage: cultural heritage belongs to us all
- Heritage at school: children discovering Europe's most precious treasures and traditions
- Youth for heritage: young people bringing new life to heritage

Sustainability

- Heritage in transition: re-imagining industrial, religious, military sites and landscapes
- Tourism and heritage: responsible and sustainable tourism around cultural heritage

Protection

- Cherishing heritage: developing quality standards for interventions on cultural heritage
- Heritage at risk: fighting against illicit trade in cultural goods and managing risks for cultural heritage

Innovation

- Heritage-related skills: better education and training for traditional and new professions
- All for heritage: fostering social innovation and people's and communities participation
- Science for heritage: research, innovation, science and technology for the benefit of heritage








Eurobarometer on cultural heritage

Public authorities should allocate more **resources** to Europe's CH (74%).

Actors that should do the most are **national authorities** (46%), the **EU** (40%), **local** and **regional** authorities (39%) or **citizens** themselves (34%).

- Holistic approach
- Mainstreaming and integrated approach

- Multi-stakeholder cooperation





5 main areas of action - 65 actions

Area of action	Example
Participation and access for all	Encouraging access through participatory initiatives such as the European Heritage Days , increasing digital access through Europeana .
Smart solutions for a cohesive and sustainable future	Supporting heritage-led local and regional development, for instance through the Urban Agenda for the EU .
Safeguarding endangered heritage,	Support heritage professionals, ensure quality principles for EU funded investments on cultural heritage, counter the illicit trafficking of cultural property.
Mobilising knowledge and research for technical and social innovation	Support advanced digitisation through Horizon 2020, foster social innovation and cultural heritage competences.
Reinforcing international cooperation on heritage	Support partner countries by providing technical assistance, information exchange and peer-to-peer learning on cultural heritage.

CLUSTER OF ACTIONS 10: Technological tools for innovation on cultural heritage


- funding for research and innovation projects on advanced digitisation and curation of digital assets under H2020
- boosting the Community of Innovators in cultural heritage
- extension of Copernicus services to cultural heritage.

CLUSTER OF ACTIONS 11: Foster social innovation and cultural heritage competences

- further implementing the "Faro Way" project
- promoting further experimentation and scientific studies on the impact of cultural production and participation o n people's wellbeing and health
- global problem solving platforms

CLUSTER OF ACTIONS 12: boosting skills in cultural heritage professions

- support to the development of qualified professionals and improvement in knowledge management and knowledge transfer in the cultural heritage sector through projects, including under the Erasmus+ programme.
