
Europeana: 23% of 58 million records are available for reuse





Barriers

- **Fragmentation** leads to Innovation gap between culture and technology (Big Tech dominates AI)
- International approach is needed which requires coordination and standardization



1. Cross-sectoral cooperation

- develop adequate impact measurements.








Cultural heritage for education
