The myth of the victory of communist army in the WW2 was at the very foundation of the socialist Yugoslavia, as it was used to legitimate the regime. The country was studded with memorial sites, remembering the victorious deeds of Yugoslav communists. After the dissolution of Yugoslavia, the inclusive antifascist narrative collapsed and was replaced by nationalist separatist narratives. The question is how local communities deal with it.
