Small towns and resilience



- Resilience of heritage in small towns
 (to prevent from decay, destruction, oblivion)
- 2. Heritage as a means of achieving resilience of a small town community (cohesive, inclusive, competitive, pro-adaptive)
- 3. Resilience of heritage-related policy, actions and strategies (sustainable, adaptable, supported by community)

Small towns and resilience



- ✓ Sustainability of cultural projects in small towns
- ✓ Double-edged impact of tourism
- ✓ Cultivation of culturally educated citizens (e.g. museum educators)
- ✓ Living standards (swimming pools, shopping malls) x culture, heritage
- ✓ How to keep visitors in the towns
- ✓ Lack of communication between institutions
- ✓ Planning open to public x only minority (already devoted) takes part
- ✓ EU money (projects): focus on spending x long-term perspective (cyclo-paths)
- ✓ Higher role of human factor (devoted people in the locality x burnt out, leave, no time, no skills)
























The main square renovation in Počátky






Reactions and controversies







Square renovation in Stříbro

- ✓ To solve traffic/parking
- ✓ To raise ambience
- ✓ To introduce more greenery.
- ✓ To revive sociability
- ✓ To highlight historicity







Square renovation in Stříbro: website comments:

- Vaste of money, monument of the city-elites (of mayor)
- Few greenery, concrete plain:
 - "... a concrete heliport on the square"
- Useless, sterile, alienated
- Ugly and unfitting
- Strong theme of Roma minority:

"... swimming pools for Gypsies"
