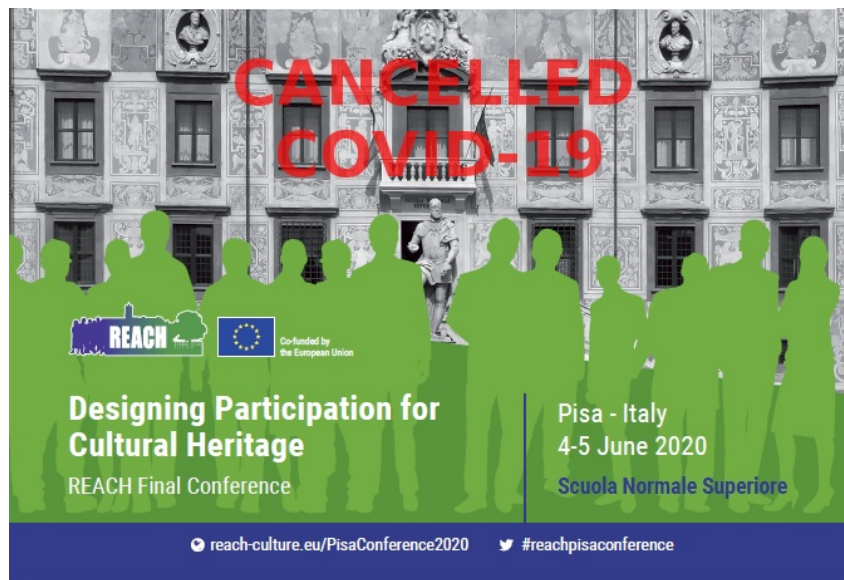




Dear All,
